General Background

Per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) are a group of manufactured chemicals used to make a variety of products ranging from clothing and furniture to food packaging. These chemicals are known for their ability to resist heat, oil, and water. This durability, however, is also what creates their health risks. Because PFAS break down very slowly, they are known as 'forever chemicals' that can build up in people, animals, and the environment. According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), long-term exposure to PFAS can result in adverse health effects including cancer.

PFAS exposure can occur in several ways including:

- Drinking water contaminated with PFAS
- Eating foods that may contain PFAS
- · Using products made with PFAS
- Working in occupations that involve PFAS (e.g., firefighting or military training)

There is evidence that DuPont and 3M, the two largest PFAS manufacturers, knew that these chemicals were harmful and intentionally hid their dangers from the public. The most hard-hit communities include firefighters, military personnel, employees at chemical manufacturing facilities, and people living in or near contaminated areas. Impacted individuals can join the litigation to hold these companies responsible for PFAS-related costs.
