General Background

Police violence is a serious problem in the United States, and one that doesn't affect all Americans equally. The rate of fatal shootings by police differs greatly based on ethnicity, highlighting a culture of racism in law enforcement. Between 2015 and October 2021, the rate of fatal police shootings was 37 for every million Black Americans and 28 for every million Hispanic Americans. In contrast, the rate for White Americans was significantly lower at 15 fatal police shootings per million white people (source Statista Research Department).

In recent years, there has been an increase in international awareness of police violence and police racism spurred on by several high-profile cases such as Trayvon Martin, Breonna Taylor, and George Floyd. Tragically, despite the publicity surrounding these cases, the Black Lives Matter movement, and the protests that took place all over the world, there is still an upward trend in fatal police shootings in our country.
